Our aims are to help people live healthy, independent lives within their community and combat social isolation. Our office on Builth Wells High Street also provides a focal point for volunteering and general information.

We have a team of volunteers who provide services to the Builth Wells community and the surrounding area (see membership area below)

These services include the Community Car Scheme, Monthly Outings and a Lunch Club, as well as others.


Demand for these services continues to grow and each year we face a challenge to raise sufficient funds to meet demand.

It has been a busy year for BWCS; we have continued to recruit volunteers for all our services (and for other organisations) and I am particularly pleased to welcome two new volunteer trustees to our Board - David Sutherland and Eironwy Davies.

All our services are operating effectively and we get consistently good feedback from users who tell us how much they value them. The Charity shop continues to trade well and provides a much needed contribution to funds; and the Board continues to pay attention to all the necessary governance matters.

This year we have undertaken a major review of policies and procedures, all volunteers have now received and signed new agreements and we have updated guidance for each of our services. This review also included a thorough examination of income and expenditure to ensure that running costs are kept to a minimum.

As I am sure you know, local government agencies have faced major cuts to their funding and this has impacted on the statutory funds that BWCS receives. This has made our own fund raising activities even more important. We are grateful to those of our members and supporters who help with this and are always seeking new ways to raise money to ensure we don't have to reduce or alter our services. There are a number of ways anyone can help: by a monthly direct debit payment, contributing on our Local Giving page (www.localgiving.org/charity/builthcs), by using our charity shop, by considering BWCS as a beneficiary in a will and by becoming a member of our newly launched 200+ Club.

I would like finish by saying an enormous 'thank you' to Cathy Warlow and Ashley Offa, to all the Board members and most of all to our loyal and hard working volunteers.

Volunteering

As the Volunteer Bureau in our area, we work with PAVO (Powys Volunteer Centre) to promote Volunteering, advertising voluntary opportunities with other organisations in our office window and on the WCVA website: www.volunteering-wales.net.




Gift Aid enables us to claim an additional 25% on top of the sale price of each Gift Aid item. In 2018/19 this brought in additional funding of £3310

Community Car Scheme

This scheme continues to play a very important part for people in our rural area, where public transport is not readily available or accessible.

The scheme provides transport for essential journeys. Our Volunteers use their own cars and are paid mileage expenses, passengers make a contribution of 35p per mile to the cost of the journey and the balance of the Volunteer expenses is now funded by our own charity shop and a donation from the Friends of Healthcare in Builth Wells.

Lunch Club

Lunch Club is now in its seventh year and is enjoyed by diners and volunteers alike.

Lunch Club provides a hot main course, dessert, tea and coffee for £4. Membership is open to anyone over the age of 60 who lives in Builth, Llanelwedd, Cilmery, Aberedw, Builth Road, and Cwmbach

Each meal takes about 25 hours of volunteer time to prepare and serve. Jobs have been broken down into bite sized pieces so that nobody feels overwhelmed and everyone can be included whatever their level of skill. All meals are cooked entirely by volunteers.

Lunch club occasionally has guest speakers from local organisations, who give presentations or come to have an informal chat with the diners

Community Work

As part of our important place in the community, our manager attends meetings with other organisations and statutory agencies - local and county wide to discuss developments and partnership working to ensure that our community benefits from any new initiatives.

One of our "shop front" windows is available to other organisations to promote their services and events.



Signposting

Due to our central position, we have numerous callers requesting information on other organisations, service providers and statutory bodies.

We have a large selection of leaflets & contact details available for these. e.g. CAB, Benefits Agency, Pension Service.

Office Support

We usually have a Volunteer helping in the office during our public opening hours as we have a steady stream of callers to the office; requests for our services, enquiries about Volunteering, Volunteers for their tasks etc. it is very varied and the Volunteers who provide office support find it interesting to see at first hand all we provide.

<u>Befriending</u>

Befriending covers a multitude of services, such as dog walking, collecting prescriptions, and some requests are in response to a particular need - where someone needs assistance until they recover from an illness or bereavement, some are long term where support with everyday tasks is required.

Library Service

This service is run in partnership with Builth Library and covers Builth Town (this area is not covered by the mobile library service) it is operated every 4 weeks.

Treasurer's Report

First the good news!

The trend of increasing the takings from the Shop has continued [well done to Staff and all our shop volunteers], this has compensated for the loss of some Transport Donations and a delay in one of our statutory grant payments which was not made until the new financial year.

We have not had to call on Reserves, [and have actually increased them slightly] and the balance sheet shows a healthy gain. It does include some restricted funding but all in all, a good year.

Although the Transport account lost some funding, it was compensated for by lower driving expenses being paid out.

The Shop accounts include a Grant for employing the volunteer coordinator. [some of which is carried over to the next financial year] so gives a slightly inflated income figure but the actual shop takings were up by over £3000.

The Main account also included extra Grants for new equipment [computers] and the website and therefore shows a 'one off' increase in spending.

Overall, the overheads remained within reasonable margins, the whole operation remains sustainable and we will be able to maintain the community transport subsidises, keeping costs down for clients.

In fact, every final bank account for the year showed an increase on last year and we have reduced the amount BWCS has to raise by our own fund raising efforts.

And now the bad news!

Our application to PAVO for the volunteer bureau funding for 2019/20 (£7000) has been turned down, we are currently pursuing this with them but this means we need to look to other sources to raise the funds. I am certain the Shop will continue increasing sales and more Donations and Fundraising will help. We will also try and apply for other Grants in order to continue providing our excellent and necessary service.
